Greg Hall Tells All in his new book

RIDETOWIN

Greg Hall survived the 'school of hard knocks' to become one of Australia's most successful jockeys.

Greg Hall did not see his mother for 12 years after his father, the great jumps jockey Ron Hall, stole him in the dead of night when he was only two. He sold papers in front of the landmark Young & Jackson's Hotel in Melbourne at 11 to feed himself, and roam the unsavoury area of Fitzroy Street, St Kilda at 12. Hall then spent 7 years as an apprentice, being shunted between Melbourne, Sydney and Brisbane.

He rode his first Group 1 winner for his father in 1978 at age 21 but returned to Melbourne to seek advice from the great **Roy Higgins** to put polish on his style. Years later Higgins rated Hall in the top 10 jockeys he had ridden against.

Hall rode for owner Mick Sayer, the underworld figure who was gunned down after the Fine Cotton 'ring-in' affair. He was a stable jockey for owner/punter/bookie Mark Read and had a hand in Australia's biggest plunge on Getting Closer. He rode for Kerry Packer and Lloyd Williams and for all the top trainers including Lee Freedman and Tommy Smith.

He did it all in the saddle, riding 49 Group 1 winners, 41 Group 2s, 43 Group 3s and 73 Listed winners. He was associated with some of the turf's greats - Mahogany, Super Impose, Subzero, Zeditave. He boasts the amazing record of winning the Melbourne, Sydney, Adelaide and Brisbane Cups; two Victoria and two AJC Derbys; two Golden Slippers and three Blue Diamonds as well as the Cox Plate.

But the good times were mingled with bad. He copped the biggest penalty in Australian racing history, two months and \$50,000, in the 1996 Golden Slipper. Worse, he twice was the victim of the booze. The first almost cost his career when he was at his peak, the second coming after his wife left him. Hall overcame all the hurdles and today is a successful media personality, motivational speaker and professional tipster. He manages **Frankie Dettori** when the champ comes to Australia.

Hall was known as an enforcer in the saddle. He would always ride to win.

This is a great story of triumph against the odds.
